Whitely is a historically African American neighborhood in Muncie, Indiana, with 2,985 residents. Since 1966, The Whitely Neighborhood Association has served the neighborhood and given a voice to those who live there. The mission of the Whitely Community Council is "To Serve and be a Voice in the Community" and does so through direct action with residents.











The Cause

The Whitely Neighborhood Community Council and Second Harvest Food Bank are excited to share our vision for a transformative project that has the potential to reshape the landscape of Whitely. Since 2016, Second Harvest and the Whitely Neighborhood Food Pantry have been steadfast partners, working together to provide immediate relief through a community choice pantry and address the deeper, systemic issues that our neighbors face. Our mission is rooted in a commitment to alleviate food insecurity while tackling the broader spectrum of resource insecurity, paving the way for residents to break free from the cycle of poverty.

The heart of this endeavor is the proposed community center at 1208 East Centennial Avenue. This facility, covering 3.6 acres and encompassing over 17,000 square feet of usable space, is set to become more than just a building. It is envisioned as a beacon of hope and progress, a Resource Hub for community growth and empowerment. The comprehensive renovation of this space will include a community health clinic, a food pantry, business incubator spaces, and more, making it a cornerstone of our vision for improving education, health, wellness, community safety, and neighborhood beautification in the Whitely area. Here are some partners who have already committed to serving Whitely through the Resource Hub.

Currently, the neighborhood sits in a food desert, with access to just one gas station and one dollar store, neither of which offers fresh, healthy food. The onsite food pantry will allow **Second Harvest Food Bank** to bridge that gap and provide the community with the food needed to thrive.


Open Door Health Services, a federally qualified health center, will host an office in the Resource Hub, providing cancer screenings, mental health services, dental care, family planning, and substance abuse counseling,

PathStone Corporation is introducing financial counseling, credit repair counseling, homeownership programs, and community development projects,

Innovation Connector will have a satellite location onsite to introduce small business counseling, business incubator space, and middle school student math programs.

Classroom space will be available for adult education and youth programming. This space will be available for Ivy Tech Community College, Ball State University, Muncie Public Library, Muncie Community Schools, and others interested in providing programming in the neighborhood.

Additionally, there will be a gathering space for the community for private and public functions and a meeting and workspace for neighborhood groups and the Whitely Community Council.



Funds raised at the Course for Community golf outing will support the renovation and construction of the Resource Hub as well as allow Second Harvest to continue the flow of food into the neighborhood even before construction is completed.
